Dear Parents / Carers

With the announcement of a new COVID 19 variant, your continuing support of twice-weekly at home lateral flow testing for secondary age pupils is sought and information is provided (below) about Onsite Lateral Flow Testing upon the return to school in January 2022

We continue to work hard in school to keep Covid-19 at bay and to follow the precautions to minimise the spread of Covid 19 with the school community. We have updated our Risk Assessment to reflect the use of CO2 monitors in classrooms and the changes announced by Government last weekend in light of the new Omicron variant. Covid Risk Assessment (November 2021). Infections have been low but having now been notified of at least 5 cases in two cohorts (Year 7 and Year 9) in the last ten days, we have now met an (early) outbreak threshold. Our cautious approach on return to school in September means the intervention steps now required of us by Public Health are not dramatic. Students and staff are already asked to wear masks in corridors and communal spaces – we will be reinforcing this message. We will continue to ensure classrooms are well ventilated and that girls are outside at breaks and lunchtimes whenever this is possible. There is already a requirement for the wearing of masks on school and public transport. Students remain free to wear masks in lessons for those where case numbers remain below the COVID outbreak Thresholds. However, for classes or groups where the threshold has been reached, these students have been asked to wear masks during lesson time and to continue to take frequent Lateral Flow Testing at home.

There is no cause for alarm but you are asked to reinforce the importance of the following with your child:

- Wearing a face mask on public and school transport
- Wearing a face mask in school in corridors and communal spaces (and in classrooms if instructed by the school)
- Observing careful hand hygiene
- Continuing with twice weekly lateral flow testing and reporting results both to public health and by e-mail to WCHS. covidresult@woodford.redbridge.sch.uk (Test kits are available via form tutors.)
- Keeping a sensible distance from others
- ◆ Staying at home if experiencing Covid-19 symptoms, or if required to quarantine (after travel), or to isolate (after close contact and /or if instructed to do so by NHS Track and Trace)
- Taking the necessary PCR tests following any travel abroad (and isolating until negative results received)
- Making an informed decision about Covid-19 vaccination and/ or flu vaccination in due course (if eligible)

You will have heard the announcement last weekend that schools are required to undertake one round of Lateral Flow Testing onsite as students return to school on Tuesday 4 January 2022. We will provide students with further information on the testing regime in the coming days, but we also encourage you to ensure your child undertakes and reports on a Lateral Flow Test on Sunday 2 January 2022 at home.

For students who have already taken part in on-site testing at WCHS, we have the necessary consent on file. However, now we need to request consent for those students who have not yet been tested on site here. Parental consent is required for students in years 7 -11. Students in Years 12 & 13 will be asked to provide written consent for themselves. A link to the relevant form will be sent out via groupcall, we ask that this is completed **before** the end of this school term.

<u>Calendar changes in response to updated local and national guidance (Covid-19 control measures)</u>

Change of live events to online events

We have taken the decision to move to online viewings for events scheduled for later this term which otherwise would have welcomed audiences on site. The decision has not been taken lightly but in the interests of continuity of education and in order to prioritise the safety of everyone in the WCHS community. **The Christmas Concert** will now be available to view online via *You Tube* on Thursday 16 December at 6pm (Joining instructions will be provided.)

To finish on a happier note:

Additional Bank Holiday to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee

You are probably aware that an additional bank holiday has been awarded in 2022 to mark the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. (The annual end-of-May bank holiday has been moved to Thursday 2 June and the additional day is Friday 3 June, creating a long weekend.)

The additional day falls in the half term holiday so in itself would not make any difference to school children and their teachers. For this reason schools have been told they can assign the additional day elsewhere in the year.

Governors have ratified the decision for WCHS to make **Friday 11 February** (the day before we start half term) a holiday. This adds a bit of flex to people's half term arrangements and lengthens a weekend. We have updated the calendar on the school website to this end. You are free to inform your child of this additional day of holiday, and to make plans as you wish.

Re: Public Health advice to reduce COVID-19 transmission in schools

You will be aware from recent government that additional measures have been introduced in schools in response to the Omicron variant. In addition, the number of positive cases among school-age pupils has continued to increase across the country and although the increases in Redbridge are not at the levels seen in other areas, the number of positive cases among pupils in our schools is growing.

We want our pupils to have the best chance to recover from the impact of the pandemic on their education – and to do that we need to ensure that pupils can attend as often as possible. The schools are working closely with Public Health and the Council to put in place as many measures as possible to help reduce the numbers of positive cases within schools.

We need all families to help their children and help their schools. We encourage you to take the following steps so you can help us all to keep schools open for as many pupils as possible and to then have a healthy break over the coming school holiday period.

Regular Lateral Flow Test (LFT) testing

The most effective way to identify positive cases is through twice weekly, if not daily, lateral flow testing. By identifying students who test positive before they come to school, this will help reduce the spread of covid within school. Many young people

with covid do not display symptoms, so regular testing helps to identify both symptomatic and asymptomatic cases.

Please test your children regularly with lateral flow tests. This needs to be done at least twice a week if your child attends a secondary school. Many parents and carers already do this. For parents whose children are new to Year 7 this year, this will be different to what you would have been asked to do when your child was in primary school. However, now that the children are in secondary, we want to particularly encourage parents of Year 7 pupils to start with regular lateral flow testing if you have not done this before.

If the lateral flow test is positive, you must keep your child off school until a PCR test result is received. If the PCR test is negative, your child can return. If it is positive, they must remain off school for 10 days following the first symptoms (or from the date of the test result if there were no symptoms present)

Testing in a covid positive household

If someone in your household has tested positive, we recommend that everyone in the household undertakes 7 days of daily testing with lateral flow tests. LFTs should be taken for 7 days from the date of COVID-19 symptoms started in the household or from the date of the first positive test if there are no symptoms. In addition, all household members should be encouraged to undertake a PCR test. Covid is commonly spread amongst a household, even in those who are vaccinated.

Please note that anyone who has had a positive PCR result within the last 90 days should not get a further test unless they have developed symptoms.

Lateral flow tests can be ordered online: Order coronavirus (COVID-19) rapid lateral flow tests.

Limiting social/non-essential activity in covid positive households

If someone in your household has tested positive, your children should still attend school unless they have symptoms or unless they test positive. However, we recommend that you limit social or non-essential activity before and after the school day for 10 days from the date of the first positive test if there are no symptoms or 10 days from the date that COVID-19 symptoms started in the household. This includes playdates, sports, parties, and any extracurricular activities. This will help to reduce ongoing transmission across the borough.

Covid vaccinations

We would encourage everyone 12 years and above to have the covid vaccination. It is very easy to book a vaccination at a local pharmacy or clinic via the NHS booking service or by calling Healthbridge on 0204 506 8833.



16 - 17 year olds now eligible for second dose of Covid-19 vaccination

The Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI) has advised that all healthy 16 to 17 year olds should be offered a second dose of the Pfizer vaccine.

The decision is based on a review of the latest evidence and has been accepted by te Government.

The second vaccine dose is available to these young people 12 weeks or more following the first vaccine dose. For those in this age group who have had the Covid-19 infection, the second vaccine dose can be given 12 weeks or more following the first vaccine dose, or 12 weeks following a positive Covid-19 test result, whichever is later. Those young people deemed 'at risk' will continue to be offered a second dose 8 weeks after their first dose.

16 and 17 year olds can access their second injection like the general public through vaccination centres, community pharmacies and GP- led primary care sites.



Dear Parent or Carer,

There have been a number incidents in various schools where school children have been posting malicious information about school staff on social media platforms such as TikTok. This may include falsely accusing them of criminal offences involving children. Obviously this is very distressing to staff and their families.

Can you please remind your child that this is a criminal offence under the Malicious Communications Act 1988:

Where a person sends a letter, electronic communication or article of any description which conveys a message which is indecent or grossly offensive, a threat or information which is false and known or believed to be false by the sender

So even if a child writes something about a member of school staff which is false or grossly offensive 'just as a bit of fun' or as a rumour and then posts it on social media – they commit a criminal offence.

The child may then be at risk of permanently excluded and/or prosecution.

As your safer schools police team, we work hard with your school to avoid school children becoming excluded or criminalised, but sometimes where the level of harm or distressed caused is so severe we have little choice but to follow these routes.

Please speak to your child regarding the sensible use of social media. Consider also using parental software to restrict what they can access and monitor where appropriate. We would also advise consideration to not allowing your children to have access to social media in their bedrooms so that this remains a safe space and reduces the opportunities to misuse social media.

If your child does genuinely suspect any adult (school staff or otherwise) of committing criminal offences then they must report this to either a senior staff member, or the police. They can also confidentially speak to Childline or report crime anonymously via the Fearless website.

- 3. Set your password


Getting creative with videos

TikTok allows users to create short-form video clips with a range of special effects to gain a following and build a community around their passions.

These videos can be shared outside of TikTok on other accounts linked to a user's profile.

How to create videos on TikTok

- Click the '+' button tap the '+' button at the bottom of and then you can choose a video from your album to upload
- Shoot tap to shoot Hold the red button to shoot a video. You can split the video into multiple sections, 15s videos are recommended but you can capture up to 60s.



Tap "pick a sound" at the top to search for a suitable sond.

2. Speed

You can set the speed of your video by tapping this button.

3. Filters

Choose a filter to make an even cooler video.

- - 4. Countdown

If you want to prepare yourself better, you can tap the "countdown" button on the right and then the shooting will start after a three-second countdown.

5. Effects

There will be hundreds of stickers waiting for you if you **tap the effects button** on the bottom of the screen.

Report a Video:


