Living with Covid Strategy

Schools, work places and homes will all be in the process of digesting the detail of the *Living with Covid Strategy* announced by the government last night.

I'm writing to you now to outline how we intend to transition to the new arrangements at Woodford, following advice from the local authority today and prioritising our continuing duty to keep students and staff safe and to prioritise above all else the continuation of education. In our navigation of the last two years we have benefited hugely from the diligence of staff, the common sense of students, and the support of parents. Thank you.

It remains the case that students and staff testing positive for Covid should not attend school. Continuing to observe a (minimum) 5-day absence in these circumstances (even after the legal duty to isolate is removed from 24 February) will lessen the chance of transmission in the WCHS community. It continues to be the government recommendation that those infected with Covid-19 stay at home and avoid contact with other people for at least 5 full days and then continue to follow the guidance until they have received 2 negative test results on consecutive days. T

This guidance should continue to be observed by all Woodford students and all Woodford staff.

With Immediate Effect:

Face Masks in school

As you are aware, on local guidance we continued the use of face masks in classrooms into February. From tomorrow, girls will be advised this is no longer necessary. (They remain, of course, free on an individual basis to continue their use in lessons if they wish.) The government is still advising that face masks should be worn in crowded spaces so we will continue to recommend that staff and students wear them in corridors around the school. They remain a requirement on public transport in London.

"The public are encouraged to continue to follow public health advice, as with all infectious diseases such as the flu, to minimise the chance of catching COVID and help protect family and friends. This includes by letting fresh air in when meeting indoors, wearing a face covering in crowded and enclosed spaces where you come into contact with people you don't normally meet, and washing your hands."

Twice weekly lateral flow testing for staff and students (without symptoms) in secondary schools
 This requirement has been removed.

From 1 April

- Free universal symptomatic and asymptomatic testing for the general public in England will no longer be provided
- Guidance on the ongoing steps that people with Covid-19 should take to minimise contact with other people will be updated to align with the changes to testing.

If you are unfamiliar with the story please see the synopsis below.

Blended Learning

(February 2022 update)

As you know, the school offers blended learning for those students who are forced to self-isolate because of Covid but who are not unwell. This is done through Microsoft Teams and SatchelOne.

Students who are accessing blended learning are expected to log on to their class Teams area at the start of each lesson, and to join the meeting link that will be set up by the teacher, within the first 5 minutes of each lesson. Should the meeting link not be ready at this point, students should wait for it to be set up (it will sometimes take longer than 5 minutes for teachers to start the meeting).

If no meeting link is set up, students should check SatchelOne for resources to work on independently for the lesson.

Please note that absences from blended learning will not be followed up by teaching or administrative staff as there are not sufficient resources to do this – students missing blended learning session would be expected to follow up on missed work when they return to school. If, on the other hand, the absence is due to technical problems, please contact the school via the relevant Key Stage Administrator, and we will try to rectify the problem.

We are grateful for your support in ensuring your daughter attends blended learning lessons in the event that she has to isolate due to Covid-19.


