To give you some ideas, please see examples below of some traditional foods that you could donate; it is not an exhaustive list, but we hope this will get your imagination (and taste buds) going!

Europe – Paella, pizza, fish and chips, lasagne, risotto, stew, pierogi, bread/potato dumplings, strudel, pretzels, cinnamon rolls, bread and butter pudding, waffles

Asia – satay, chilli crab, kimchi, noodle dishes, dim sum, sushi, biryani, curries, tandoori chicken, samosas, spring rolls, onion bhaji's, egg custard tarts, coconut cakes, Turkish delight, ras malai, Asian sweets (mithai), baklava

Africa- Jollof rice, piri piri chicken, tagine, beyenatu, mandazi, plantain, doro wat, malva pudding, vitumbua, injeta,

North America – buffalo chicken wings, hamburger, hot dogs, poutine, meatloaf, fajitas, tacos, burritos, pozole, tortillas, apple pie, key lime pie, beaver tails, churros, cheesecake

South America- ceviche, empanadas, arepas, reineta fish, churros, alfajores, tres leche cake, Brazilian brigadeiros

Oceania – Australian pie, Sapasui, tim tans, chiko rolls, anzac biscuits






