





Dear Parents / Carers,

School closed to all students tomorrow (Wednesday 1 February 2023)

Parents are reminded that WCHS will be closed to students tomorrow because of the impact of the national NEU strike.

The text of Friday's letter to you on the subject is copied in below for easy reference.

We have been informed by the National Education Union (NEU) that they will be taking industrial action in the form of a strike on Wednesday 1 February 2023.

This action is not against the School itself but is part of national industrial action organised by this trade union about teachers' pay and its funding. We have not been informed by the union of which members of staff will take action, but believe that a significant proportion of teachers at Woodford will be involved.

Neither the governing body nor the Head are legally allowed to close the School 'in sympathy' with the strike and we will not do so. However, we are responsible for the safety of our students. A risk assessment has been completed. Supervision levels on the day of the strike will not be adequate to ensure the safety of our students on site and for this reason Woodford will be closed to all students on Wednesday 1 February 2023. Those teachers who are working on Wednesday will be setting work for their timetabled classes via Satchel One. Students should check communications there first thing and throughout the day. They are otherwise advised to use the time to catch up on any outstanding work, to review or revise recent learning and to read for pleasure. They need to take home any necessary resources on Tuesday afternoon.

For attendance purposes the absence of students will recorded as "exceptional circumstances" and therefore your child's attendance record will not be affected. Students entitled to free school meals will have access to their Wednesday meal allowance until Friday next week.

I write to you now to give you notice of this issue. I regret having to close the school but consider there to be no safe alternative. School will resume as normal for all students on Thursday 2 February 2023.

You will be aware that the NEU has published a schedule for strikes nationally if resolution is not reached in the interim. For this region the other notified strike days are

- Thursday 2 March (London, South East, South West)
- Wednesday 15 March 2023: England and Wales
- Thursday 16 March 2023: England and Wales

Risk assessments will be conducted nearer to the time with regard to these three dates and communicated to you. It is important to note that decisions will be made about each day affected by industrial action separately, arrangements and expectations may differ as we navigate a period which will be challenging for everyone.

South America- ceviche, empanadas, arepas, reineta fish, churros, alfajores, tres leche cake, Brazilian brigadeiros



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


