#### **Uniform consultation**

We are very grateful to the 118 parents who responded to our recent survey regarding uniform supply. Parents provided views regarding the potential provision of a second uniform supplier and of second hand uniform which will guide us as we work to make progress in these areas. Although the survey wasn't primarily about items of uniform itself we did give parents the opportunity to comment on this matter to inform future planning. Thank you for doing so. The clearest message communicated was that it is increasingly difficult (and expensive) to procure appropriate white socks, and particularly white tights. We will look into this matter next term and seek some student input. Adverse weather conditions reduced the size of the focus group which met in school on Thursday 15 December but it was immensely useful to speak directly with parents on the subject of uniform.

Meanwhile, with the holidays upon us, I write as I usually do to remind you to consult uniform requirements when purchasing new items (particularly shoes and coats) and before authorising (and paying for) hair styles or piercings which will be at odds with our uniform requirements. It is particularly in these areas where problems are occurring currently.

### Uniform Requirements & limitations on Hair Colour and piercings

For greater clarity and consistency the guidance is updated as follows:

### Hair

- I. **Hair Colour:** Hair should be of **one** natural colour. Hair extensions of any kind must be of the same colour as the student's natural hair.
- II. Hair must be neat (and tied back where of a length to be so) and the face clearly visible
- III. **Hair slides or hair bands**, worn for functional purposes, must be navy blue, black or brown (and hair bands no wider than 2")

#### IV. Beads and other decorative accessories are not allowed

Uniform requirements are clear, they are known to students and they are readily available to parents. They apply to all students and the same procedure will be followed with any student failing to comply. Heads of Year will write home setting a time line for the matter to be rectified. We do understand that in many cases this involves both inconvenience and expense. Therefore we would urge all parents and carers themselves to ensure hair colour complies with our uniform policy during term time and that students' elaborate (and often very beautiful) experiments with colours are confined to holiday periods and removed before school resumes.

#### **Jewellery**

Jewellery may not be worn except for religious symbols worn out of sight and one plain small gold, silver, pearl or diamante stud worn in the lobe of the ear. Students should not have piercings done at a point which means the associated jewellery needs to be worn in term time. A clear plastic stopper is the only option in this scenario and it is the student's / parent's responsibility to supply this. Again Heads of Year will follow up continuing non-compliance by direct contact with parents.

#### Make-up

Students should not wear make-up, nail varnish or false eye lashes whilst in uniform. Students will be given the wherewithal to remove make-up / eyelashes in school. Failure to do so, or repeated non-compliance will be notified to parents.

Uniform expectations do need to be consistently reinforced in all schools. We do students no favours at all by overlooking their non-compliance. While there is no inevitable causal link between persistent flouting of uniform rules and under-performance, you will readily understand that a level of negativity can be generated for the student and that repeated confrontations on the matter are not conducive either to a positive schooling experience or to students making the most of the education and the opportunities available to them here. It is only a very small number of students currently who are flouting the rules cited above. However, it is important the matter is nipped in the bud. Young people feel injustice keenly – rules need to apply to everyone, and to be seen to do so. I trust we can rely on your support as we make it very clear they do.




