Dear Parents / Carers

Safe return of all to school – Wednesday 14 December 2022

The heavy (and unexpected) snow fall locally on Sunday evening in impacting on schools across the region will also have disrupted your schedules. Thank you for your patience as we have worked to assess the situation and to ready the site for the students' return. It is at least the case that students can these days readily switch into *WCHS Remote Schooling*, however, we hope it is a back-up strategy we will only seldom have to use.

With freezing temperatures set to last all week, there is no thaw to help us in our snow clearing mission. Our sizeable school site remains deep strewn with snow. Caretakers have done what they can to clear vehicular access and to prepare routes for pedestrian passage between buildings. We are grateful to them. The site remains icy, however, and on returning **students must exercise due caution**. Until surfaces are safer they will initially be asked to remain indoors other than when in transit. Please do talk to them about the need for care en route to school (roads are clear but pavements are not) and when here. We don't want students to hurt themselves and families to face long anxious waits at over-stretched A&E Departments in the run up to the holidays.

Please ensure students are sensibly shod and dressed for current conditions

- It is vital that students wear sturdy shoes or boots with good grip in current conditions. (Ballet pumps, slip on shoes etc. are simply not up to the job.) Appropriate boots are acceptable (and sensible) footwear for school in this wintry weather
- Advise your daughter to wear layers: a t-shirt invisible under the school shirt, a jumper, a blazer (if she has one) and a coat (plain black or navy).
- All students should wear coats to school. While this wintry weather persists, they can wear them in transit throughout the day
- Scarves, hats and gloves are advisable. Public transport is subject to delay even young people begin to feel the cold when kept waiting outdoors for any length of time

Thank you for your support in this matter. We hope for easier work and travel conditions from the weekend onwards.

Here's a Scottish Tablet recipe for you to try this Christmas!

- 900g granulated white sugar (Yes, that much sugar!)
- 250ml of full-fat milk
- 1 tin of sweetened condensed milk (397g tin)
- 85g butter

Using a large pan start by melting the butter, sugar and milk together, keep stirring to avoid catching on the bottom.

Then once melted, add the condensed milk.

Bring to a brisk simmer, mix will expand and boil over if you don't have a big enough pot.

Once it starts to darken, (or reaches 120'c) take it off the heat and stir continuously for 10 minutes (or place in a mixer) until it starts to cool and thicken

Once thickened, pour into a lined tin and cool for 2/3 hours, then mark out the lines of your portions before putting in the fridge to set.

(If you tablet didn't set then it means you didn't get the mix hot enough). You're looking for a crumbly consistency, not to be confused with fudge.

If the person or team you nominate are shortlisted, they will be invited to a spectacular awards ceremony to be held in Wanstead next April 2023 – it will be a night to remember!


