Statement of Condolence on the Death of Queen Elizabeth II

The staff, governors, pupils and families of Woodford County High School are profoundly saddened at the death of Her Late Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II.

Everyone in our school community gives thanks for Her Late Majesty's service and dedication.

We offer our thoughts and condolences to the King and the Royal Family.

Schools will shut on Monday 19 September 2022 for the State Funeral of Her Late Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II

Everyone in the WCHS community will have been saddened to learn of the death on Thursday afternoon of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. The loss is great, for the country and for her family. A Statement of Condolence on behalf of us all (as above) is displayed on our website. It is of course only three months since we took the chance here in school to celebrate the seven decades of the Queen's reign and the extraordinary service, dignity and compassion exercised throughout. Students entered into the spirit of our Platinum Jubilee event with their usual warmth and I'm sure we are all glad they will carry these memories forward.

Schools, as public bodies, are to follow an agreed national protocol (known as *Operation London Bridge*) on the death of Her Late Majesty. The protocol requires us to take some actions and potentially to avoid others. It gives the following outline of the 10-day programme of public mourning.

- D Day is classified as Day of Death
- D+1 is Proclamation Day & the accession to the throne of the new King
- D+3 The King starts a tour of UK receiving motions of condolence
- Between days +4 and +9 there is a formal *lying in state*
- On day +10 the State Funeral will be held. It has been confirmed that the State Funeral will take place on Monday 19 September 2022. The day has been designated a Bank Holiday and schools – including WCHS – will be shut for the day.
- A 2 minute national silence will be held at 11am on the day of the funeral. Books of condolence close at the end of the day following this day of mourning.

Advice is that we continue to implement the curriculum as planned. We will take opportunities for direct teaching in classes or assemblies about the life of Queen Elizabeth II and her reign and about the significant moment in history which together we are currently experiencing. Supporting young people to talk about loss and acknowledging a sense of bereavement is actively encouraged at home as in school.

Actions planned to date for WCHS:

- On Friday 9 September we marked a 2 minutes' silence at noon.
- Our website enables students, staff and parents to find information and links to books of condolence they may choose to sign
- Everyone in the School community may access the Redbridge Council website for updates about the Floral Tribute Site on the South Lawn of Valentines Park and about vigils being held across the borough throughout this week at 6pm on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. <https://www.redbridge.go.uk/hm-queen-elizabeth/redbridge-vigil>
- Assemblies yesterday and today (12 & 13 September), taken by Mr Colin Jenkins (a history and politics specialist) will focus on the development of the monarchy, its place in the constitution and the transition from the old sovereign to the new. They will mark a moment as historic as it is sad.
- The school will be shut on Monday 19 September for the State Funeral of Her Late Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II.

As together we navigate ten days of national mourning, we seek to be responsive to the needs and wishes of those we serve. It is important everyone feels that as a community we have marked the moment, and the loss, appropriately.

Please remind your daughter to bring in her lanyard, locker key and fob to school every day.





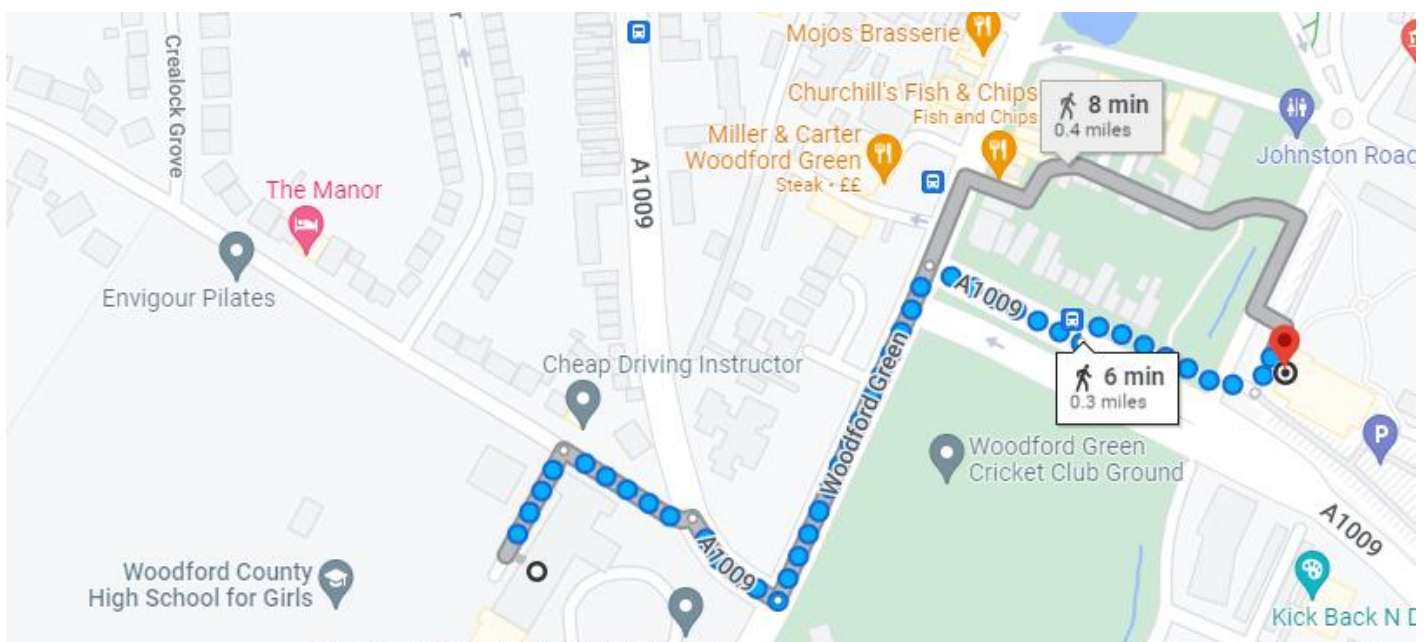
PARKING / STOPPING AROUND THE SCHOOL

YEAR 8 HPV VACCINE

Year 8 **HPV vaccination** is taking place at school on 20th September.

Jazz band is a group for wind, brass and percussion players of grade 4/5+ standard. We primarily play big band music but there are opportunities to learn improvisation skills and perform solos within ensemble playing. We perform at concerts and events like the summer showcase.

Junior choir is our main choral ensemble for years 7-9, run by Yolanda Thompson from Redbridge Music Centre. It is also an excellent group to participate in for new students in year 7, reinforcing musicianship skills required during the curriculum. No previous singing experience is required, and so the group gives great confidence to those looking for a friendly environment to develop their abilities while also producing high-quality performances for concerts.

The **orchestra** is the main music ensemble of the school which plays music from the classical repertoire plus arrangements and film music. All string/wind and brass instruments are welcome and entry requirements are for students to be at least grade 4 standard.

String orchestra is a group for all string instruments for students at least grade 3 in standard. We will be tackling some 20th-century Russian repertoire this term.

Junior band is an excellent group for younger musicians, from those just beginning on an instrument up to grade 3 in standard, to engage in an ensemble playing a variety of musical arrangements. All types of instruments are welcome, regardless of previous experience. Again, this is an excellent opportunity for younger musicians to build up confidence in performance and develop skills which also strongly support their curriculum work.

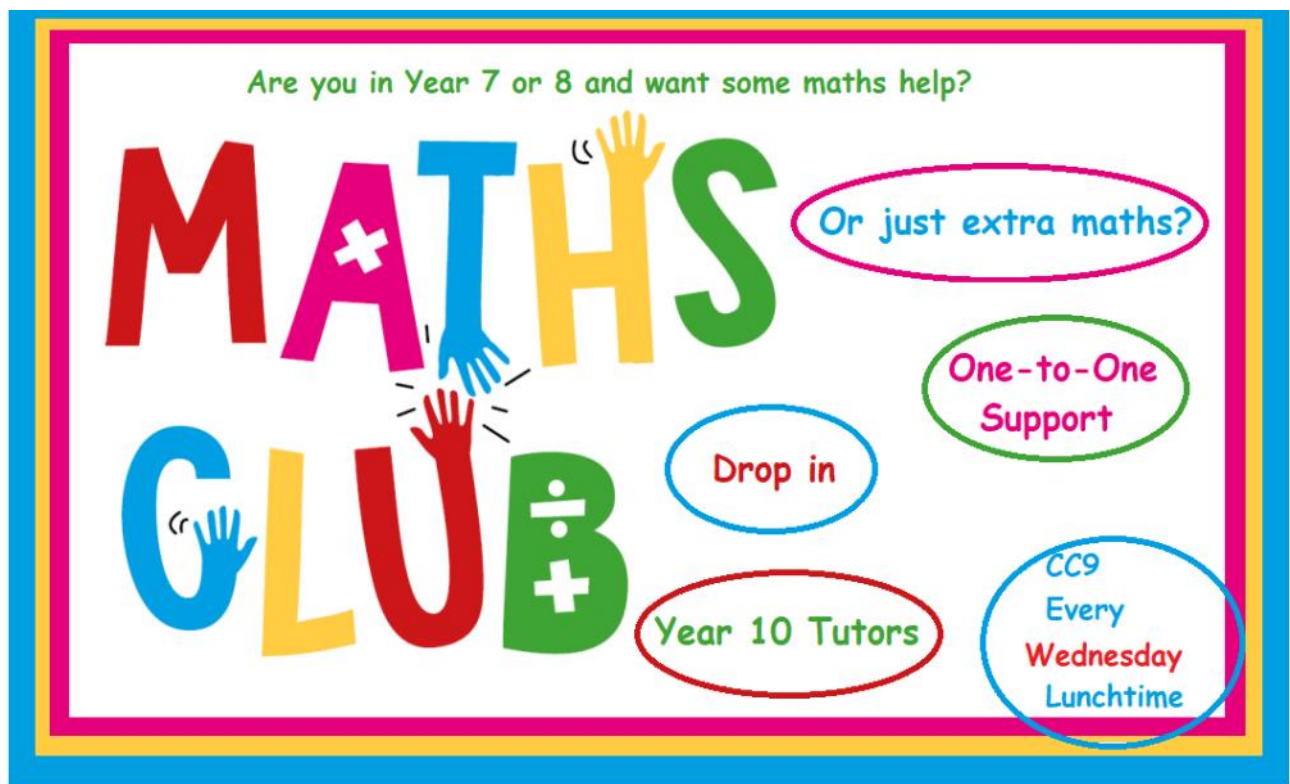
The **brass ensemble** welcomes students from beginner to advanced level to take part playing music for the end-of-term concerts. This group is particularly appropriate for musicians who have previously done the year 8 brass projects as part of the curriculum lessons, and is an excellent next step in developing their instrumental skills. Instruments can also be provided by the tutor so please do come even if you do not own an instrument.

The **senior choir** is an excellent ensemble for years 10-13 which tackles more challenging and diverse repertoire for performance in concerts and other functions. Again, as with other groups, new-comers are always welcome in this friendly and supportive environment.

Theory and **GCSE/A-level support** provides theory tuition at all levels for those wishing to build up their theory knowledge. GCSE and A level students are also supported in their studies for example in coursework or revision.

Chamber groups – This is an opportunity for self-led student groups to run rehearsals with the support of music staff when required.





Maths Club is a drop in session open to all Year 7 and Year 8 students run by Ms Gribble and older students. Students will normally receive one-to-one support and can ask for maths challenges or specific maths topics they would like help with.

The sessions start at 1:40pm and finish by 2:20pm in CC9.

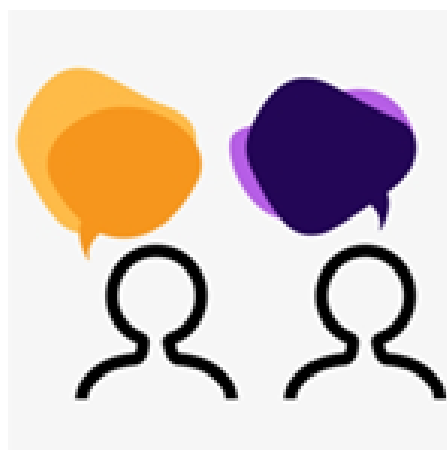


Educational Psychology Parent Helpline
