Dear Parents and Carers

School re-opened yesterday and I'm pleased to report we have had a positive and productive start to the term. Students were delighted to see each other after the long summer holiday and we are pleased to welcome them back. Our joiners in Years 7 and 12 are finding their feet and navigating the site, with the ready support of their peers. We work to a two week timetable, of course, so it will be some time before everyone has experienced a complete run through but we've got off to a good start. Today we are undertaking a walk-through of our fire evacuation and lock down drills. Important early safety routines.

Uniform

The vast majority of students (Year 7 - 11) have presented in correct uniform. I'm grateful to parents and carers for your support in this matter. Where this is not the case (for example where canvas shoes or trainers are being worn), contact will be made with home by tutors or Heads of Year in order that this be speedily rectified. Uniform is important and will continue to be monitored. We do students no favours at all by sanctioning non-compliance.

On the subject of uniform, we will be looking to contract a second uniform provider alongside Lucilla's. As some parents will recall, John Lewis withdrew their service to us some years ago, as did a secondary local provider before that. The addition of another provider ideally will increase flexibility and convenience for parents as well as introducing an element of competition with regard to quality and price. For that reason we will shortly be asking interested parents to join a consultation group to look at uniform supply as well as to seek feedback on aspects of the uniform. In line with new regulations and in order to reduce cost we have already greatly reduced the number of "regulation" PE kit items, allowing parents to shop around for cheaper alternatives. We have arguably less flexibility in this regard with the WCHS uniform itself but need to ensure best value is being achieved.

In July I asked parents to retain any good quality items of uniform no longer in use in order that some spare items / second hand uniform be available in school. Thank you if you have done so. There is a receptacle outside the Student Support Office where your child can deposit any such items.

679 Bus

We have two dedicated WCHS buses on this route at the end of the day. KS3 students finish at 3.20pm and are allocated to the first bus, KS4 students finish at 3.30pm and take the second. Senior teachers supervise the process. Year 7 are obviously new to the process but we will impress on them the importance of getting out to the bus promptly at the end of the day. Where students miss their bus the options are to wait for the shared 679 bus just after 4pm (also used by Trinity and Bancrofts) or to use the (frequent) 179 service. Parents are asked to talk through these contingency measures with their child. Students also have the option of joining activities after school or signing into the homework club (3.30 - 5.00pm) if that is more convenient to parents.

Attendance

Attendance is strong at Woodford and this contributes in no small measure to the success of our students. Clearly students who are ill should not attend school and this is particularly important if they present an infection risk – for example, if they have been displaying symptoms of Noro virus, flu or Covid-19. However, parents are asked to avoid their child too readily opting to stay home. This impacts on their resilience and ultimately (*demonstrably*) both their performance and their self-confidence. Conversely young people that brave the test that is making them nervous or front up to a teacher about a homework running late, learn that they can manage these ups and downs perfectly well.

New caterers

Thank you for supplying your child with a packed lunch yesterday. Our new caterers "Innovate" launch their offer today - students will, I know be keen, to sample their wares. Parents can view the menu at any time from our website. If your child is to use the catering service (breakfast, break or lunch) you will need to ensure that her ParentPay account is kept topped up. This online payment system also gives you oversight of what she is purchasing from our caterers. With regard to Parent Pay meal balances, an upgrade to the school tills will have been undertaken over the summer holidays. As a result, some balances may be showing as zero. Please be advised that once your daughter has activated her account by purchasing an item in the canteen, the balances will be restored to the correct amount. Innovate will be launching an after-school offering (before After School clubs) soon. More information will follow in due course.

Reason to celebrate

Public examination results at both A-Level and GCSE gave us plenty to celebrate this summer. We are very proud of the way both students and teachers have navigated the challenges of the past two and a half years and delighted that the resilience and determination shown has been so richly rewarded by simply outstanding results. You may peruse the results on our website. Firm foundations have been laid for A-Level study (in the case of Year 11) and for university and employment (Year 13). Such achievement will also, we hope, bolster the confidence of students preparing for 2023 examinations who were exhorted in yesterdays' assemblies to get into good study habits from the first. Progress in academic study really is incremental – every half an hour well spent makes a difference.

We look forward to working in partnership with you this year to the benefit of your child and her education. I wish you and your family well as those term-time routines re-establish themselves!


PARKING / STOPPING AROUND THE SCHOOL



Jazz band is a group for wind, brass and percussion players of grade 4/5+ standard. We primarily play big band music but there are opportunities to learn improvisation skills and perform solos within ensemble playing. We perform at concerts and events like the summer showcase.

Junior choir is our main choral ensemble for years 7-9, run by Yolanda Thompson from Redbridge Music Centre. It is also an excellent group to participate in for new students in year 7, reinforcing musicianship skills required during the curriculum. No previous singing experience is required, and so the group gives great confidence to those looking for a friendly environment to develop their abilities while also producing high-quality performances for concerts.

The **orchestra** is the main music ensemble of the school which plays music from the classical repertoire plus arrangements and film music. All string/wind and brass instruments are welcome and entry requirements are for students to be at least grade 4 standard.

String orchestra is a group for all string instruments for students at least grade 3 in standard. We will be tackling some 20th-century Russian repertoire this term.

Junior band is an excellent group for younger musicians, from those just beginning on an instrument up to grade 3 in standard, to engage in an ensemble playing a variety of musical arrangements. All types of instruments are welcome, regardless of previous experience. Again, this is an excellent opportunity for younger musicians to build up confidence in performance and develop skills which also strongly support their curriculum work.

The **brass ensemble** welcomes students from beginner to advanced level to take part playing music for the end-of-term concerts. This group is particularly appropriate for musicians who have previously done the year 8 brass projects as part of the curriculum lessons, and is an excellent next step in developing their instrumental skills. Instruments can also be provided by the tutor so please do come even if you do not own an instrument.


The **senior choir** is an excellent ensemble for years 10-13 which tackles more challenging and diverse repertoire for performance in concerts and other functions. Again, as with other groups, new-comers are always welcome in this friendly and supportive environment.

Theory and **GCSE/A-level support** provides theory tuition at all levels for those wishing to build up their theory knowledge. GCSE and A level students are also supported in their studies for example in coursework or revision.

Chamber groups – This is an opportunity for self-led student groups to run rehearsals with the support of music staff when required.







Maths Club is a drop in session open to all Year 7 and Year 8 students run by Ms Gribble and older students. Students will normally receive one-to-one support and can ask for maths challenges or specific maths topics they would like help with.

The sessions start at 1:40pm and finish by 2:20pm in CC9.

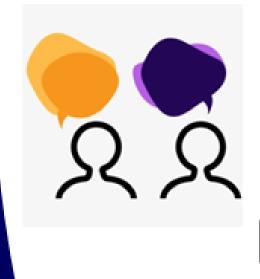


Educational Psychology Parent Helpline
