#### Two important dates to note for September / October 2023

#### 1. Friday 15 September 2023

WCHS Remote Schooling to resume for one day to accommodate 11+

This year, for a number of practical reasons, the 11+ test (2024 entry) for the two Redbridge Grammar schools will be held on a week day, rather than a Saturday. Many grammar schools up and down the country have been testing on a week day for a number of years now. On Friday 15 September, therefore, Woodford students will be asked to study at home with live teaching delivered via WCHS Remote Schooling for the day. (Ilford County Students will also study from home on that day.) Broadly speaking teachers will be teaching their classes (on-line) for the day and support colleagues will be administrating the 11+. In excess of 1200 candidates sit the 11+ each year at WCHS (two sittings). We will thus be hosting the equivalent of the entire school population on site, hence the need for our own students (other than any asked to come in to help with the 11+) to study from home. It is appreciated that students working from home presents some challenges for parents. Hence this early notification. My thanks in advance for your support with this matter.

#### 2. October Non-pupil Day pushed back one week

Our October Open Evening (for prospective students and their parents) is booked for Wednesday 11 October 2023. This has necessitated a change to the scheduling of our October Non-Pupil Day (a training day in school) which will now occur on Thursday 12 October 2023. This amendment has already been made on the website (under Term Dates) and the date and arrangements will notified to you again nearer the time. Here we simply draw your attention to a change to the INSET Day date previously released on our website.

There will be no after-school clubs.


#### Coronation May 2023: Woodford to join in the national celebrations

At Woodford we seek to contribute to and to mark the history being made around us and to furnish all our students with a memory of notable events. Hence we celebrated (among other things) the London Olympics in 2012, the Tour de France Peloton whizzing past our gates in 2014, our own school centenary in 2019 and the Queen's Platinum Jubilee last year. On 6 May 2023 (some three school weeks from now) King Charles III will be crowned in Westminster Abbey – and everyone, we hope, will enjoy the associated Bank Holiday Weekend.

We will mark the occasion in school on Friday 5 May 2023 with a lunch time street party, an associated activity we think our students will enjoy (shhh! under wraps!) and a couple of prize-worthy challenges. To allow our highly creative students to exercise their imaginations to the full, I draw your attention and theirs in advance to our two coronation competitions. - A dress-up challenge: in place of uniform students are asked to dress as royalty for the day: "Kings and Queens historical, fictional or fantastical".
- A baking challenge: Coronation Cupcakes or Cookies

We hope we'll have a colourful and enjoyable day and that those all-important memories will be made. There are no additional costs for students associated with the day but it will be in their interest to have just a little bit of cash at hand at lunchtime. (We'll remind them nearer the time.)



#### LBR New campaign to help feed children at Easter – can you help?

- 1) The London Borough of Redbridge (LBR) have launched a fundraising campaign with local charity, Tin in a Bin, to be able to provide food vouchers for families struggling with the cost of living during the Easter holidays. This will be for children who are not eligible for free school meals but need some extra help. Those who are eligible for FSM will receive vouchers as this is funded through the Household Support Fund. They are hoping to raise enough funds to support 200 children across the borough.
