Dear Parents / Carers,

Further NEU Strike Action: Thursday 27 April and Tuesday 2 May 2023
YEAR 11 Students to attend lessons / assessments on site on both days
KS3, Y10 and Sixth Form students to study at home via WCHS Remote Schooling

As you are aware (WCHS bulletin last week), all the main teaching unions' members voted to reject the recent pay offer and the NEU has given notice of two further strikes on Thursday 27 April and Tuesday 2 May. This action is not against the School itself but is part of national industrial action organised by this trade union about teachers' pay and its funding. We have not been informed by the union of which members of staff will take action, but believe that a significant proportion of teachers at Woodford will be involved (as was the case on strike days last term).

In its guidance to its members the NEU reflects the concern of its teachers for their students making final preparation for public examinations (chiefly students in Y11 and Y13). Dispensations have been made therefore to allow NEU members to support the conduct of scheduled assessments, for minimum levels of supervision on site to be achieved for examination cohorts and to enable teachers to provide revision guidance / to set work for / to teach these cohorts where they choose to do so.

In taking decisions about provision at Woodford on the two days in question, both the necessary risk assessment (supervision levels on site) and discussions with our NEU representatives about dispensations agreed for examination year groups in the coming fortnight have been taken into account. On that basis, please be advised of the following arrangements:

- Year 11 students should attend school on site on the two days in question and register as normal in their form rooms. Planned GCSE assessments (Art practicals and MFL orals) will go ahead as scheduled. Lessons will be delivered in classrooms where possible. Many teachers who will be taking industrial action on the day have indicated that they will set revision work for examination classes or attend in person to deliver lessons for exam classes only. At points in the day when on site lessons are not available, Year 11 students will be supervised in Computer Rooms in order to focus constructively on work set, on practice papers or revision materials. Catering will be available to them at both break and lunchtime. School buses will run as normal.
- Year 13 students will study from home via WCHS Remote Schooling (MS Teams, SatchelOne and MS Office 365). This time many striking teachers have undertaken to set work or to teach Y13 live on MS Teams to reduce impact on examination preparation. Y13 should expect a greater proportion of their lessons to be delivered live via MS Teams than on previous strike days. (Please note that Year 13 students have been given the option, individually, to work on site via WCHS Remote Schooling on the two days if they feel it is helpful to them to do so.)
- Students in KS3, in Y10 and in Year 12 will study from home via WCHS Remote Schooling (MS Teams, SatchelOne and MS Office 365). Online teaching levels for these cohorts are likely to be similar to previous strike days. Students should use any time at their disposal (lessons when they are not being taught on line) to catch up with work, to start revision for summer exams or to read for pleasure.

Provision for the upcoming strike days is somewhat complex. All teachers have been asked to brief their timetabled classes in advance so all students have a sense of the shape of their day and of what they are expected to do when. It is also recommended that students check school e-mails and SatchelOne at the beginning of the day and that they log into MS Teams for the first 5 minutes of each timetabled lesson to avoid doubt.

Students will be reminded of the importance of having the right resources to hand for each of the strike days.

Reminders:

- The Y10 Parents' Evening on Thursday 27 April has been rescheduled to Thursday 4 May 2023.
- Monday 1 May and Monday 8 May are Bank Holidays and the school is therefore closed.
- For attendance purposes the absence of students will recorded as "exceptional circumstances" and therefore your child's attendance record will not be affected.
- Students entitled to free school meals will have access to their Strike Day meal allowance throughout the weeks in question.

Thank you for your careful attention to the content of this e-mail as we prepare to navigate the continuing industrial action and the challenges it presents to all concerned.


Success with Leyton Orient!




