-Exam Week

Woodford County High School is conducting an internal exam week the week after half term (i.e. week of 5th June 2023). Students have been given their exam timetables. Please note :

- Students should arrive in school at the normal time.
- Students need to register in the room they have been allocated for the exams. They
 will only have access to their form rooms from 8.20-8.30am, at break and at
 lunchtime. Students must therefore organise themselves well, in order to ensure they
 have everything with them that they need for their exams.
- They will be responsible for bringing all the equipment they need for the exams (pen, pencil, rubber, ruler etc) with the exception of paper. Liquid corrector (e.g. Tippex) is not allowed.
- All classes in Years 7-9 have been allocated two hours of PE in exam week. Please make sure students bring in their PE kit on those days.
- It is strongly recommended that students bring a reading book. They cannot read during an exam, even if they have finished, but they may be permitted to read at other times. Magazines, e-books etc. will not be allowed.
- If they do not have an exam, PE or Library session, they will be expected to revise, although they may also read a book during, with the permission of their teacher.
- Mobile phones should be kept in lockers as normal. Years 7 & 8 may collect their phones from lockers at the end of lunchtime *if* they are normally kept in lockers in form rooms and that form room is being used by either Year 9 or 10 for an exam. They must be kept in bags during the PM session, switched off.

END OF THE DAY: From 5th June Year 9 will finish at 3.30pm instead of 3.20pm. This finishing time will continue until the end of term.


