Dear Parents / Carers

We look forward to welcoming students back to school tomorrow. We hope they and you enjoyed a good and restorative summer holiday. The latter half of the holiday gave us the chance to celebrate examination results with the classes graduating both KS4 (GCSE) and KS5 (A-Levels). The students concerned are to be congratulated on the results themselves and what it took to achieve them. For Year 13 students these were their first ever public examinations – and both cohorts have with resilience navigated not only the impact of the pandemic but also the doom-ridden predictions of the media in the lead up to August results days. We are all aware that nationally the top grades have been sharply and deliberately reduced. We are very proud of students who retained focus and perspective throughout and achieved some excellent results. Furthermore we are pleased to report that the vast majority of the departing Year 13 students have their university places secured, including the 8 heading for Oxbridge colleges and the 19 accepted onto medical / dentistry and veterinary Science courses.

Reinforced Autoclaved Aerated Concrete (RAAC)

There has been much coverage in recent days of school closures caused by the presence of super-annuated RAAC in school buildings constructed between 1950 and 1990. You will be aware that our school accommodation primarily consists on the one had of a 18th Century Manor House and on the other of our new Centenary Centre opened in September 2017. By reason of date and construction method subsequent building additions and extensions fall outside the notified period of concern. When asked to do so in December 2022 we promptly completed the RAAC questionnaire. For complete reassurance we are now in the process of commissioning a site survey on the matter.

Redbridge has issued a statement on the RAAC concern which you can read <u>here.</u> As a local authority they too are conducting an immediate investigation of all LBR sites to provide further reassurance.

Message from your Safer Schools Officers: Talk to your child about phone safety

Mobile phones are a great way to stay in contact with family and friends. Most Secondary School aged children now own one or have access to one.

As useful as they are, they can make children vulnerable to thieves who are particularly interested in new models and other valuable items such as cash, airpods and expensive coats. Reducing robbery is our top priority and our officers are working hard to catch those responsible, with activity to prevent it taking place daily.

There are however, a number of things you can do to help reduce your child's risk of becoming a victim and keep safe whilst using their phone. If you can, talk to them about where and how they use their phone using the following advice:

Safety when out and about:

- Keep your phone and valuables out of sight in a safe place when travelling to and from school. Be careful when you take your phone out in public places.
- Bus stops, train stations and surrounding areas are common target areas for thieves, who can approach on foot, moped or on a pedal bike or e-scooter.
- Earphones/headphones can distract you, stopping you from seeing or hearing someone approach you from behind.
- Don't confront a thief it's not worth risking your own safety for possessions that can be replaced.
- Robbery or attempted robbery are serious crimes and should be reported. It's important you seek help straight away by dialing 999 rather than contacting police when you get home or at school the following day. Use a friend's phone or the phone of a trusted adult. This gives us the best chance to catch the suspects, recover any stolen property and ensure your safety.
 - If you have information about a robbery and do not want to report it to police, speak to Fearless 100 % anonymously at <u>www.fearless.org</u>. Fearless is the youth service of independent charity Crimestoppers.

Whether you have a phone or not, memorise or keep a parent/carer's phone number in a separate place in your bag/zipped pocket in case of emergency.

Help protect your child's phone if it's stolen:

- Use your device's security features, apps or PIN locking mechanisms to protect your data and prevent the phone being used.
- Keep a record of the phone's IMEI number (not on your phone!). This is a 15-digit unique number which can be obtained by keying in *#06#. You need this information if the phone is lost or stolen.
- Consider installing a tracker app, available online.
